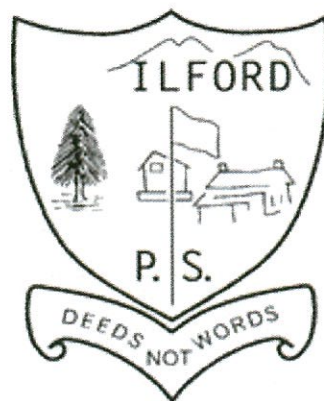

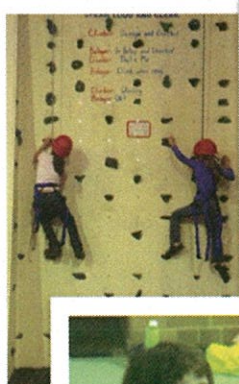
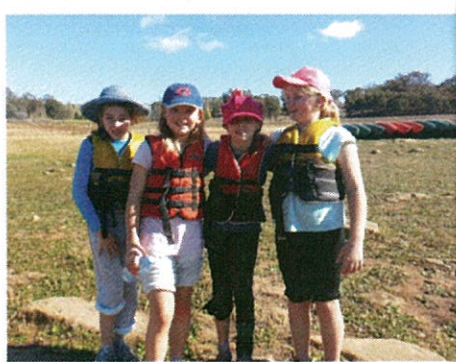
School Recipe Book
